Give a “thumbnail” sketch of your family heritage. How has that heritage shaped your own outlook on life and the person you have become?

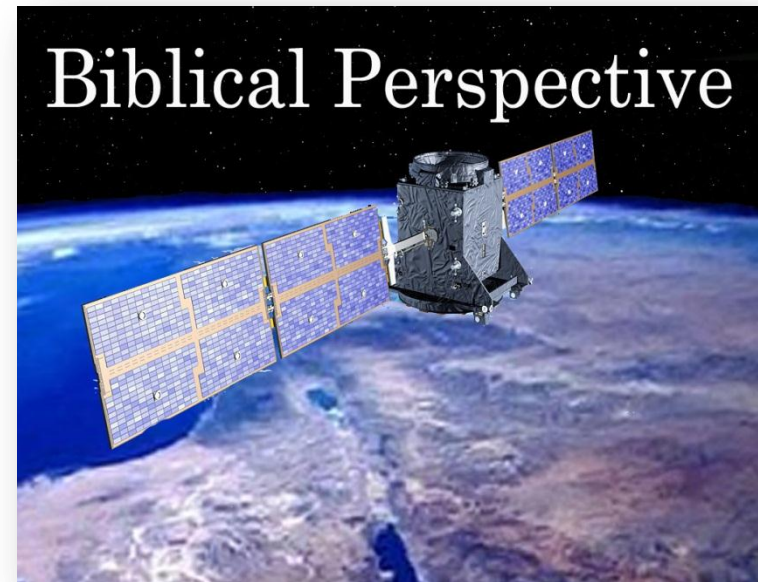
The Books of the Kings highlight the connection between obedience and blessing and disobedience and disaster. How has this worked in your life?
