What impressions have you drawn over the years from the pastors God has put into your life? What were some of the major lessons you learned from them? How did they help you? What did you do when they challenged your values or upset you, by what seemed at the time to be overstepping boundary lines? Were your pastors loved, admired, appreciated, venerated, resisted, or ignored?

I already had a number of pastors in my life before I ever became one. Today, let's focus on the roles and responsibilities of pastors as described in the life and words of the apostle/pastor Paul. How will this impact the way we respond to God and His plans for us, courtesy of the pastors He places in our lives and churches?


