Personal Application and Interaction

Make sure you personalize your response to each of the following questions that formed our outline of the message on Mark 1:14-32.

1. How do I know when I am ready to hear from God?

How do I recognize this in someone else?

- What prepared the disciples to leave their nets “immediately” and follow Jesus?
- How is that helpful for my own interaction with those who have yet to become Christ-followers?

2. What makes me think I can trust Jesus?

- What questions linger in my mind about the incident in the synagogue (vs. 21-28)?
- How have various “disturbances” worked to remind me of the authority of Jesus? How has my trust in Him been strengthened?

3. How do I express my gratitude to God?
