That's what they do. But they kept reassuring us; it's been, I don't know, I think they said 50 years since an American League team won a 7<sup>th</sup> game of the World Series on the road. That's history...not baseball. My hope went out the door when the countdown began; *"the Dodgers are down to their last 9 outs...8...7...6...5...4...3...2...and the Huston Astros are World Champions!"* Countdowns are great for rocket take-off. They're not so great when your team is losing...or when you're up against the Lord's prophetic description of the way you will disown Him.
