When the day you were filled with great joy the day your child or a grandchild was born, it doesn't take much to imagine the delight of God the day you came into this world. All the more, I'm certain of His pleasure the day you turned to Him and trusted Him as your Lord and Savior. Moved with that understanding, the apostle Paul urges us to take care of ourselves as God's precious possession. Do you remember all those times when someone said to you, "take care of yourself'? Likewise, God reminds us...take care...! Well, He says it this way:

Hollow and deceptive philosophy which depends upon...


