- 3. What's your reaction to the idea that these women were somewhat surprise witnesses to the crucifixion and burial of Jesus?
- 4. Pastor John MacArthur writes, "[God] always works by providentially orchestrating natural processes and ordinary events to accomplish His purposes. Miracles are rare and involve a temporary suspension of the laws of nature, but providence is constant (cf. John 5:17) and incalculably more complex." How was God's providence displayed in the crucifixion of Jesus?
