Whether you've been in jail as a visitor or a resident, it's a challenging and disarming place. We've been thinking about the words of Jesus in Acts 1:8, "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." We've been following those witnesses, going in the power of the Spirit into cities, on shorelines, and today...into jail?

So where are we taking the message of hope in Christ that God has laid on our hearts? When will we break out in a song of salvation?


