Why do you think the apostle John identified himself as, "the disciple whom Jesus loved"? Describe yourself in relation to Jesus.

Jesus used many metaphors to describe His relationship to His followers. Which one of those has most impacted your walk with Him?

Jesus repeatedly said He was sent by the Father (4:34). It impacted everything He said and did. That gave a mission cadence to John's Gospel (17:3, 6-8, 18, 20-23). He prayed earnestly that His disciples would be one in spirit and purpose and that this would prompt the world to believe that the Father sent Him. In what ways does our togetherness help the world conclude that Jesus was sent by the Father?

How can or does John's Gospel fit in your efforts to turn others to Jesus?

The book of Act endeavors to continue the record of Christ's ministry through the Holy Spirit after the ascension. How have you seen that work continue throughout our ministry?

Jesus told His disciple they would be His witnesses when the Holy Spirit came upon them. He referred to Jerusalem, Judea, Samaria and the uttermost parts of the earth. Translate those geographical locations into application for our ministry under the Spirit's empowerment.
