There is power associated with anything that is rare. Gold is a good example of this power due to rarity. Humility is rarer still—humility is powerful. It's a trait Jesus wants us to exhibit as His disciples.

In spite of the Old Testament's emphasis on humility, pride was a defining characteristic of the Pharisees of Jesus' day. They were proud of their religious achievements and status. Pride motivated them to love the place of honor at banquets, the best seats in the synagogues, respectful greetings in the marketplace and being called Rabbi.

Restrained from offending others


