We are in the midst of an experiment. We have called it an experiment in doing ministry together. Over the past six months our churches have worked together in areas of children's, youth, and young adult ministry. We have had work days and met around tables for celebration dinners and events. We have listened to accounts of each other's spiritual journeys, and worshipped together. In so many ways, we have humbly experienced some of what Jesus prayed for in John 17..."that all of them may be one, Father, just as you are in me and I am in you. May they also be in us that the world may believe that you have sent me". So what are we doing to "make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit"? So, what are we doing to be perfectly united? And, what after all, is "unity"?
