A major theme of the New Testament is sin's power to destroy the spiritual and moral health of the church as well as of the individuals who commit the sins.

Unfortunately outright sin is not the only danger to a church's spiritual health and unity. Although they are not sins per se, certain attitudes and behavior can destroy fellowship and fruitfulness in the church. They have also crippled the work, the witness and the unity of countless congregations throughout church history.

These problems are caused by differences between Christians over matters that are neither commanded nor forbidden in Scripture. They are matters of personal preference and historic tradition, which, when imposed on others, inevitably cause confusion, strife, ill will, abused consciences and disharmony.
